Connecticut Specific Changes

How to interact with kids 15 minutes — go over chart page 6-7

Stop Injuries Before They Happen 15 minutes — discuss car seats. Discuss Connecticut car seat law (copy attached). Discuss gun safety, bicycle/helmet and drowning safety in addition to video.

Glove practice for 10 minutes instead of 2 minutes

Discuss hand washing for 5 minutes instead of 1 minute in addition to video

Discuss/practice finding the problem for 10 minutes instead of 8 minutes

All testing over 10 minutes instead of 6 minutes

Injury Emergencies — Bandaging practice for 15 minutes instead of 8 minutes

Injury Emergencies — Splinting practice for 20 minutes instead of 8 minutes
